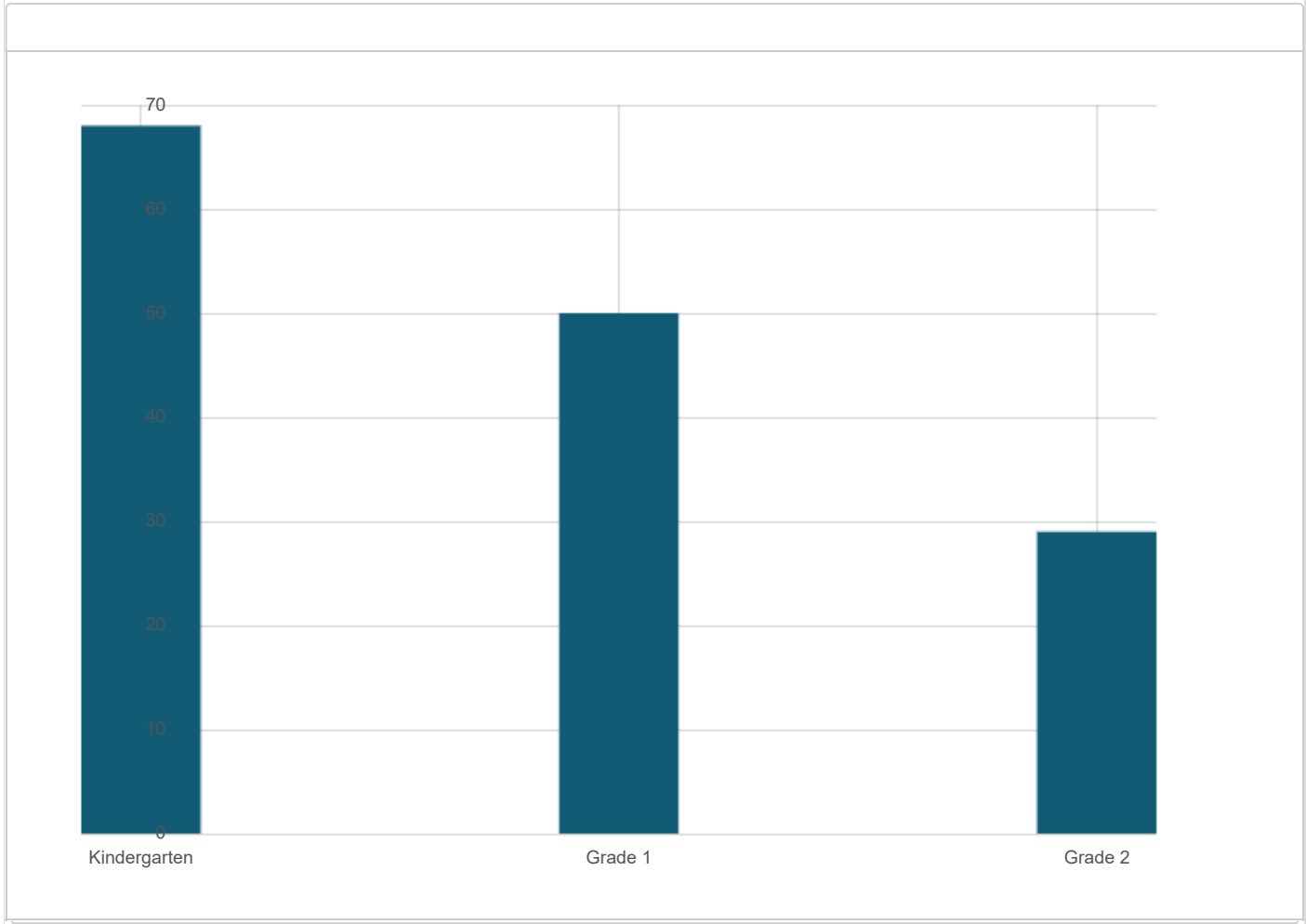

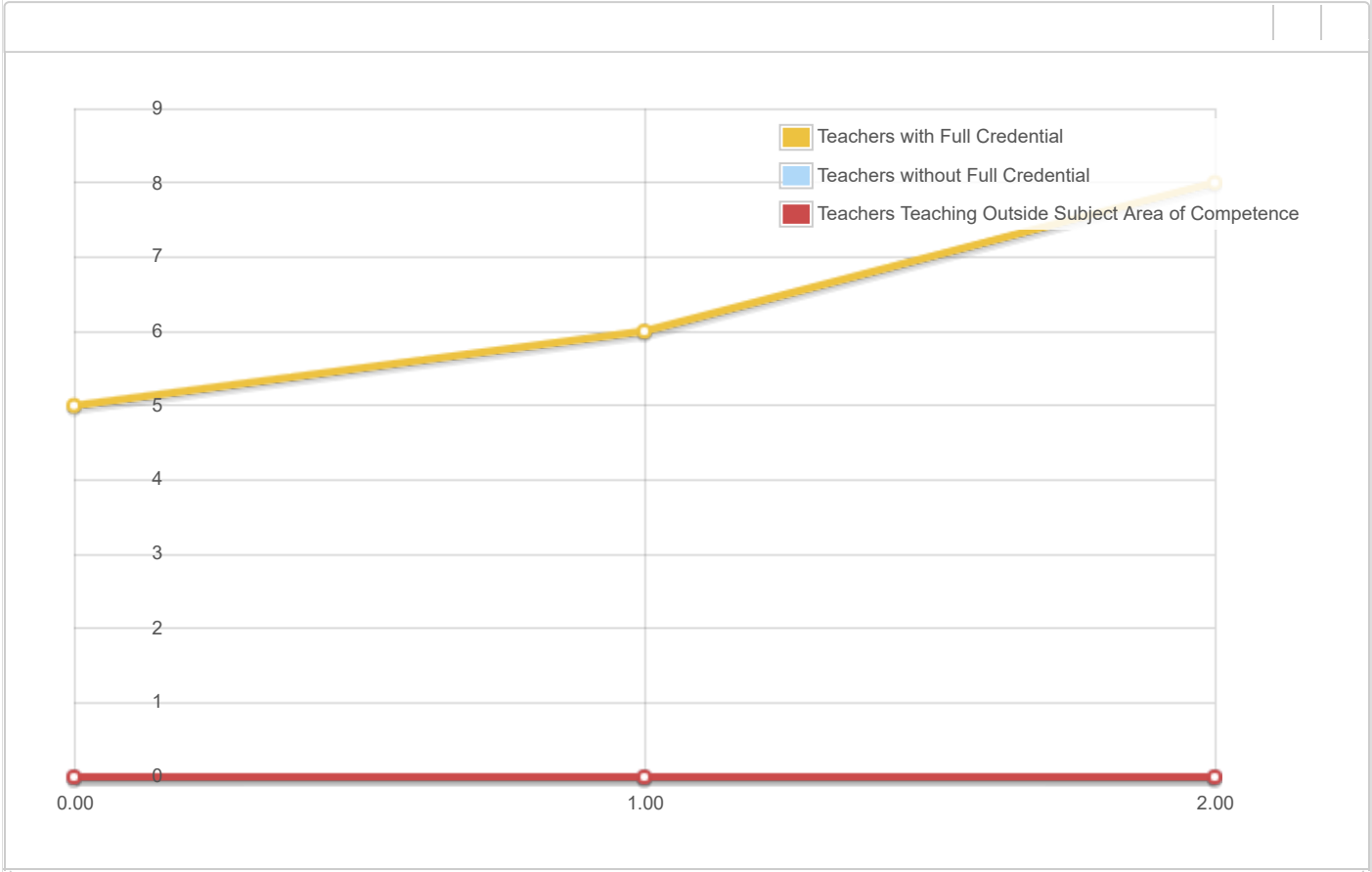

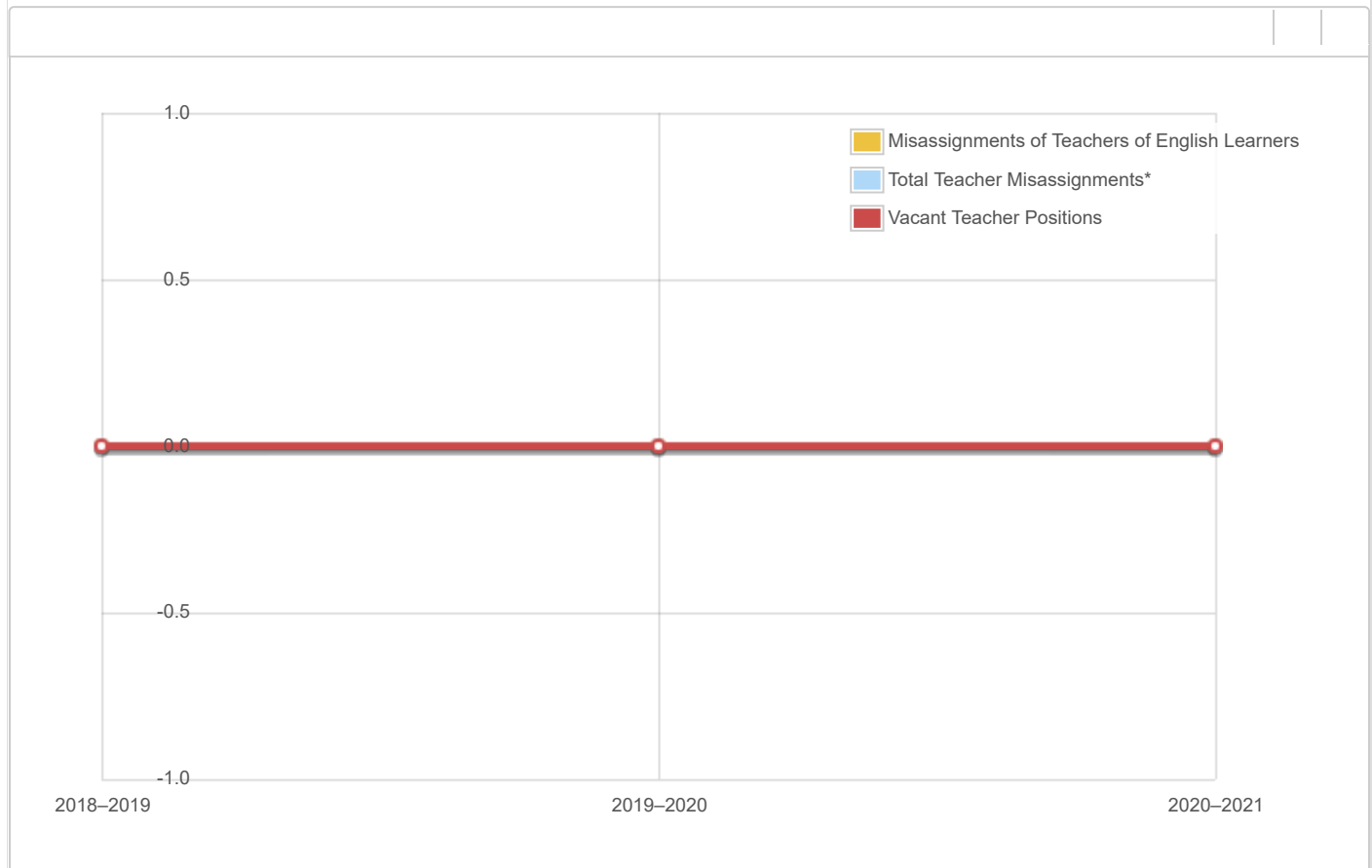

School Safety Plan (School Year 2020–2021)

Soleil Academy prioritizes safety for all students and staff members. We prepare for emergency situations by creating a school safety plan that entails different scenarios to consider. Our goal is to reduce the risk of injury and minimize confusion in a state of emergency by practicing different drills throughout the year. The School Safety Plan is reviewed on an annual basis in June and approved by the board prior to the first day of school. The Safety Plan is presented and rehearsed by our staff during summer Professional Development. During the school year, drills are regularly rehearsed in various scenarios to ensure staff is trained and refreshed on emergency procedures. The last time the safety plan was reviewed, updated, and discussed with our stakeholders was on September 9, 2020. Key elements include but are not limited to earthquake, intruder, active shooter, and fire drills.
